Services and Sections:

Civil Registration Section; Resident registration, seal (hanko) registration, passport issuance, and publishing of other certifications and permissions, procedures of national health insurance and national pension plan and long life medical care for the elderly.

Elderly Welfare Section; Application of long-term care insurance and support of the elderly.

Tax Section; Issuance of certifications, (local) taxpayer assistance (needs reservation)

Accounting Section; Payment of tax (except national tax, prefectural tax and national pension premiums) and royalties.

-Enhancement of ICT (e.g. tablets and electronic blackboards) helps improve ability of each student.

-There are exchanges with kindergarten kids and activities in groups of different grades.

5. Rotavirus Vaccine Becomes a Routine Vaccination from Oct.

(1) What is Rotavirus?

Gastroenteritis due to rotavirus manifests as sudden vomiting, frequent watery diarrhea and fever. Some patients can require hospitalization due to complications such as dehydration and seizure associated with vomiting and diarrhea, renal failure, and/or encephalopathy. Rotavirus is the most common cause of severe acute gastroenteritis requiring hospitalization.

(2) Eligible children for routine vaccination

Children born after Aug. 2020. Coupon is sent to eligible children when they become one and a half month old.

(3) Adverse reaction

If symptoms of intussusception (exhaustion, pale face, repeated vomiting, repeated dysphoria, bloody stool, flatulence) are observed after vaccination, particularly within two weeks after the initial vaccination, promptly consult a doctor.

(4) Types and schedule

There are two types of rotavirus vaccines. Both vaccines have an effect in the prevention of infection by rotavirus. Choose either type and have your child receive the vaccination at the appropriate time.

-Monovalent vaccine containing live attenuated human rotavirus is orally administered twice (1st: 6 weeks after birth or older, 2nd: up to 24 weeks after birth at intervals of at least 4 weeks).

-Pentavalent vaccine containing 5 bovine-human reassortant rotaviruses is orally administered 3 times (1st: 6 weeks after birth or older, 2nd and 3rd: up to 32 weeks after birth at intervals of at least 4 weeks).

*It is recommended that the initial vaccination be given after 2 months and no later than 14 weeks and 6 days after birth.
